THE DOWNTOWN HOLIDAY MARKET

THE FCPS BUDGET

The Budget Task Force was appointed to study all FCPS programs and services. Their task was to study every program and make recommendations to reduce, eliminate or modify existing programs. After many meetings over the past several months, the Budget Task Force recommendations were made public on November 9th when they were presented to the School Board. It is important to remember that though the recommendations have been published, no decisions have been made.

The next few months will see the budget process continue with many meetings between the Fairfax County School Board, the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors and community members before they reach a decision on the FY 2017 Budget. That final decision will occur on May 26, 2016.
