AFTER TRANSFAIR-WHAT TO DO?

You went to Transfair, but you did not obtain a position. What to do? Is there any chance left for you to transfer to another Fairfax County Public School? Our advice to you is not to give up yet.

If you are interviewing now, don't stop. Continue to stay active with calls and resumes. You can continue to interview over the summer. Check the vacancy list daily, since it is frequently updated with new openings. Some teachers move out of state in the summer or retire, and new positions occur unexpectedly.

Before you interview at another school, be sure to read about the school on the web. You need to familiarize yourself with the school's profile, mission statement, and test scores. You will want to be knowledgeable, informed, and prepared. And, don't forget to dress appropriately and smile.

Remember that any teaching transfer should occur by July 31, 2015. After that date, you will need both principals' permission to make a change.

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POINTERS FOR YOU

It's coming to the end of the school year, and your lives are busier than ever. Student discipline may be more of an issue now, so well-prepared lesson plans will help to keep students engaged and on task. At this time of year FCFT thinks that some items should be reviewed with you.

- The FCFT office often gets phone calls from teachers with problems. Then we request a follow-up call from that member and nothing happens. Our calls and e-mails go unreturned. We keep wondering what has happened. If you call about a problem, please keep in touch. Some people call and then seem to disappear.
- We can deal with situations best if you make an appointment and come into our office after school. Bring any documents pertinent to your concerns with you.
- If you are called to a conference within FCPS, identify who is present at the conference. Be cautious in what you say and don't make any intemperate remarks. Call us as soon as possible.
- Special Note: If there is an outside party in the meeting who
 represents law enforcement (Child Protective Services or Fairfax County Police), you do not have to meet with the group.
 You have Constitutional Rights which you do not want to
 jeopardize. You should request separate meetings with legal
 representation, and contact FCFT immediately.

SUMMATIVE EVALUATIONS SOON

May and June will bring summative evaluations. **All evaluations must be signed**. Signing does not mean that you agree with any negative items; it means that you have read the evaluation. If you do not agree with the final evaluation, you may write a rebuttal. Rebuttals will be attached to your summative evaluation and placed in your file.

Please contact our office if you receive a "conditional reappointment" or a "not recommended for reappointment."
