The Task Force has been meeting for the past few months and will continue to meet to assist the Superintendent in preparing the FY 2016-2017 Budget for the School System. Steve Greenburg is a member of the committee. Steve is also a full-time Elementary teacher in FCPS, and ours is the only organization whose president also teaches. In August several members of FCFT were delegates to the AFL-CIO Convention in Williamsburg. The Credentials Report said that 180 members were registered. The group decided which politicians they would support in the November elections for the VA House of Delegates and the VA Senate. Governor Terry McAuliffe addressed the group and cited his accomplishments for the state in working on Virginia economic development. Lt. Governor Ralph Northam, who is a Norfolk pediatric neurologist, said that economic development equals a world-class education. He said he is very interested in early childhood development, good nutrition, access to immunizations, and healthy life styles.

### LOCAL ELECTIONS COMING

Tuesday, November 3, 2015, is fast approaching. On that date you will have the opportunity to vote for members to the Virginia Senate and the Virginia House of Delegates. In Fairfax County you will vote for the Board of Supervisors, School Board, Northern Virginia Soil and Water Conservation District Directors, Clerk of the Court, Commonwealth's Attorney, and the Sheriff. You must be registered by October 13 if you are planning to vote. New voter registrations are accepted year-round, and they are available at most public libraries, DMV offices, and the state and local government offices.
